### **Kansas beats estimates for April**

TOPEKA - Total tax receipts for the fiscal year through April were \$4.7 billion or \$2.6 million more than estimates, which is \$123.5 million more than the previous fiscal year-to-date.

Sales and use tax receipts beat estimates for a second month and were \$4.9 million more than expectations.

Individual income tax receipts were \$774,000 more than estimates and \$52.9 million, or 23 percent, more than revenue receipts for April 2015. The increase was helped by an 8.3 percent increase in withholding tax payments and a 31.6 percent increase in balance due payments for April.

"We are happy to see individual income tax receipts increasing compared to last year, particularly withholding taxes. They are a good sign for the health of the economy," said Revenue Secretary Nick Jordan. "We are also pleased to see use and sales tax receipts increase for the second month in a row."
